

DAILY INDOOR SAFETY CHECKLIST

Toys and children's equipment, e.g., tables, high chairs:	
1. Toys and equipment are in good repair and do not pose a choking hazard	
2. All accessible toys are suitable for age group served and are nontoxic	
3. Broken/unsafe toys and equipment removed from environment	
4. Toys are stored safely/Earthquake safe	
Cots/Cribs:	
1. Cribs free of choking/smothering hazards (i.e., blankets/bumpers) and meet consumer safety standards	
2. Cots/sleep mats are stored when not in use/Bedding does not touch	
3. Cots/sleep mats are in good repair	
Storage:	
1. Cleaning materials, detergents, etc., are inaccessible to children	
2. Chemicals stored separately from food	
3. Medicines* stored out of children's reach/in a locked box* at the temperature stated on container with appropriate doctor's order * Excludes emergency medications	
4. Items that pose an injury/smothering risks (i.e., knives, plastic bags, matches) are inaccessible to children	
5. Safety latches on cupboards are in good working order	
General:	
1. Entries, exits, and walkways are clear. Exit doors can be opened easily by adults. Exit alarms are in working order	
2. Trash bins are clean, covered and emptied daily	
3. Floors are clean/in good repair and free of slipping/tripping hazards	
4. There are no cords within children's reach, e.g., curtain/blinds/electrical cables	
5. Electrical outlets have safety plugs	
6. Windows and screens in good repair
