## Temporary Individualized Health Care Plan (Anaphylaxis)

(Hot Sheet) CF/H-8f New 1/16 (mandatory)

When a child has an identified allergy with risk of anaphylaxis requiring on-going medical treatment and physician care, the nurse or designated health staff will work with the child's physician and parent/guardian to develop an Individualized Health Care Plan to ensure the health and safety of the child while at a Head Start Center or Family Child Care Home.

Until medical verification is received, the nurse or designated health staff will work with the child's parent/guardian to develop a temporary plan of care for allergy with risk of anaphylaxis until a final plan can be approved by the medical doctor. After the plan is completed by the nurse or designated health staff, the parent will sign the plan and it will be followed until required medication forms are completed by medical doctor.
