**Policy:** Public Alert Radios distributed to Head Start Programs will be utilized to

provide alerts and safety steps about a variety of emergencies due to weather, telephone outages, disruption of 9-1-1 emergency services, hazards materials

threats or missing children.

## **Procedure:**

1. Each Delegate shall establish a central location for the radios in an area that is consistent with staff being near to hear alerts.

- 2. Radios are to be registered online to confirm placement. The Alert Radio remains property of the US Government.

    If radio is located at non-public school site complete the licensing agreement and attach the US Government stickers supplied.
- 3. Radios are to be programmed for Alerts pertinent to Center or FCCH location and potential to hazards in the area. (FEMA website <a href="http://www/fema.gov/forpastnaturaldisasters">http://www/fema.gov/forpastnaturaldisasters</a>)
- 4. When Radio Alert is broadcast, refer to Emergency Disaster Preparedness Plan for procedure and plan to follow.
